LEGAL AND FINANCIAL INFORMATION

The Mendocino County Fire Safe Council, Inc. (MCFSC) was incorporated on March 3, 2004 (incorporation number 2635163), and its Bylaws were approved by on April 27, 2004. Its fiscal year is January through December; financial records are kept using Quickbooks Pro software.

The Council is recognized as a charitable nonprofit corporation under Internal Revenue Code §501(c)(3) effective September 14, 2007, and under California Revenue and Taxation Code §23701d effective September 25, 2006. Before receiving its nonprofit status, the Council operated as a program of another nonprofit organization.
